Connect

What's your most interesting scar story?

Learn Read John 20:24-29. Jesus had already appeared after His resurrection to Mary Magdalene and to a group of his other disciples, but Thomas wasn't with that group. They told him that they had seen Jesus, but he refused to believe them until he saw Jesus' scars.

- Do you find yourself more sympathetic to Thomas or critical of him? Why?
- Does your own faith journey have anything in common with Thomas? Have you heard other people talk about their faith but had your own experience with Him later?

Jesus said, "Blessed are those who have not seen, and yet believe," but Thomas is not the only one who saw Jesus before he believed. Read the stories in **John 20:1-23** (especially verses 8, 14, 18, and 20). What do you think Jesus meant by this statement? How do you think the first audience of John's Gospel would have heard this?

- Many people think of faith as what you try to believe even when the evidence says otherwise. It would be the opposite of reason. Although a full picture of Biblical faith needs more than just this one passage, what would you say about Christian faith based on this story?
- At the end of the story, Thomas said to Jesus, "My Lord and My God." He is the first person ever to call Jesus "God." In John's artfully written Gospel this climactic scene finally closes the loop from John 1:1 where we were told "the Word was God." What do you think it means that this piece of Jesus' identity isn't fully revealed until now?

Apply

Read Galatians 6:17. Paul said he had the marks of Jesus, probably meaning the scars of his own persecution (2 Corinthians 11:24-28). He implies that suffering is not evidence that God has abandoned us. It is evidence that we are walking with and like Jesus in this world.

- Have you ever suffered any loss because of your faith? Can you imagine that experience becoming a part of your Christian witness?
- What do you think God could do with your wounds to help someone else and perhaps even to strengthen their faith in Jesus?
