Do you remember when you learned about hell growing up? How did you learn about it? What questions do you have about heaven and hell?

One thing we find in the gospels is that Jesus didn't see a discontinuity between a loving God and the reality of hell. How do you see him holding these two realities together in the following passages?

- **Read Mark 10:26-33 and John 3:1-21**. How did Jesus change the Jewish expectation of what Nicodemus thought the Messiah was coming to do?
- Why does Jesus say someone needs to be born again to enter the Kingdom of God?

Read some of the passages where Jesus talks about the reality of hell.

- Read Matthew 16:13-19. What promise does Jesus give the church about hell?
- **Read Matthew 5:22, 29-30, and 18:6-9**. How does the reality of hell serve as a warning to the people following Him?
- **Read Matthew 25:31-46**. Who does Jesus say hell was created for originally? How does he say the reality of heaven and hell should impact how we live on this earth?

Read a couple of the passages about how the first Christians talked about the final judgment.

- **Read 2 Peter 3:8-14 and 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11**. How did the Second Coming of Christ and the final judgment serve as an encouragement to the first believers?
- How did it serve as a warning?
- How did the reality of God's future cause them to live differently in the present?

How has the reality of heaven and hell impacted you today? What questions are you still wrestling with?
