Do you have a favorite book, movie, TV show, or restaurant? Tell your group about it.

"Witness" and "testimony" are two important words the Bible uses to describe the process of telling other people about Jesus. Read the example of John the Baptist in John 1:29-34 and Jesus' words to his disciples in Acts 1:1-8.

- What do witnesses do?
- How would you describe what John's and Jesus' other disciples were supposed to do?

Imagine a courtroom. Witnesses are not attorneys or judges. They do not argue or decide the truth. They simply describe what they have seen or experienced.

- Read James 4:12. If you were going to describe your Christian experience to someone, does it make any difference to know that it's not your job to be the judge of their faith?
- Read John 16:7-15. Jesus sometimes calls the Spirit a "counselor" or "advocate." The Spirit will prove and establish the truth about him. How would your witness to Jesus be different if you didn't think it was your job to "prove" the truth to people?

Sometimes, people reject Christian testimony. Jesus was often rejected (for example, Luke 4:28-30), Jesus' first disciples were rejected (Matthew 10:14), and the Apostle Paul was rejected around the world (2 Timothy 1:15).

- The testimony of a witness is not always accepted, even when it is true. Do you think people would always accept your testimony?
- How does it make you feel to know that people didn't even believe Jesus or his first, spirit-empowered witnesses?
